

In March, the CETF Board of Directors and Board of Expert Advisors hosted a Sacramento **Public Forum** to understand the importance of, and strategies for, improving connectivity goals and outcomes.

The day began with a tour of **Leataata Floyd Elementary School** (LFE), a school where the culture focuses on nurturing the whole child, supporting social-emotional development, and giving each student the support they need to learn and grow. The school has an on-site Food Literacy Center where students learn to prepare healthy meals with ingredients from the garden. Board Directors and CETF Partners also had the opportunity to see the schools public Internet installation which also serves the neighboring public housing community.

Taking Action: Internet Access Is A 21st Century Civil Right

The Digital Equity Bill of Rights (AB414), authored by Assemblymember Eloise Gómez Reyes moved out of Communications and Conveyance with amendments and was referred to the Appropriations Committee where it passed and now moves to the Assembly for a floor vote.

AB414, which establishes the Digital Equity Bill of Rights at no cost to the state will set a new goal for the state to see that every Californian has access to broadband. CETF is championing this important piece of legislation to bring us a step closer to achieving true Digital Equity and closing the Digital Divide in California - Join Us!

In April, we were thrilled to learn over 2 million Californians had enrolled in ACP. It is crucial to understand the California enrollment numbers as there remains more than \$1 billion annually in ACP to be claimed by residents.



We are so pleased with the powerful impact of working together.





Recent Research from USC ARNIC shows this is mostly because eligible households—including those already enrollment in Pell Grant, Medi-Cal, CalFresh, and WIC—are not aware of the program.

Experience has shown that the most powerful strategy to increase enrollment is for credible sources, trusted by communities to notify directly all ACP-eligible households and to coordinate with community-based organizations (CBOs) to assist in-language and in-culture those residents who would benefit from the program.

To make progress in reaching unaware groups, CETF in collaboration with CBOs, grantees partners, and local government, has hosted 20 **Get Connected! California** ACP Enrollment Events this year.


ACP Enrollment Update: The California Numbers
