# 5 Roles of Local Governments in closing the Digital Divide, promoting Digital Inclusion, and achieving Digital Equity

# Policy Leader

Promulgate policies that determine the jurisdiction's attention and attitude about broadband technology and define the approach to facilitating or discouraging capital investment in deployment and adoption by residents.

#### Planner

Prepare land use and other related plans (such as for economic development) that guide the development in the jurisdiction, thus determining "how smart" growth will be and defining quality of life for residents.

# ❖ Regulator

Adopt implementing ordinances for polices and plans that promote "smart" infrastructure, facilities, and buildings consistent with "Dig Once, Dig Smart" objectives.

# Consumer Purchaser

Purchase and utilize technology which can enable residents to access information and services, increasing demand for technology and encouraging innovation and competition to develop new applications that will increase productivity.

# Service Provider

Provide information and services online through broadband that increases the relevance of technology to consumers, encourages adoption, and reduces impacts on the environment. Redwood Coast Connect Broadband Consortium
